

"HELP US HELP YOU"

Security is an always evolving discipline. We are confident in our Security teams' ability to monitor the hall and your booths, during show hours and after the show closes. However, there are things that you, our valued vendors, can do to help us maintain the most secure venue possible.

- **"Protect Your Assets"** Invest in a simple 4 channel DVR system that can record your booth during show hours and after hours. Not only will this deter theft but it will give you more evidence, if needed, should there be loss. Consider renting a small safe for your booth to put in your high value items, for better protection. If kept in a case on a table at your booth, make sure it is locked and covered when you leave for the day. During show hours, do not leave valuables on your back table unattended or in easy reach of someone.
- "Strength In Numbers" If you see something/someone that is suspicious, notify Security immediately. We can all play a part in keeping the Expo safe and secure. By doing this you can alert Security to suspicious persons and get it investigated quickly. This includes if you see people on the show floor without proper credentials, report them to Security immediately.
- **"Time To Go"** When you hang about the hall after closing hours you put an additional strain on the staff watching the remaining vendors & the clean up crew at the same time. When leaving the convention hall, remove our show badge. The show badge can, in essence, put a target on you for a criminal looking for a crime of opportunity.
- "Watch Your Six" Always be aware of your surroundings. This is especially true when you're away from the hall and walking to a parking structure. When walking back to the hotel or to the parking garage, walk in groups when possible. Always have in your mind that someone is watching you and act accordingly. Once you arrive at your car, do not leave items loose in the car (backseat, front seat) or in plain view. Secure valuables in locked cases and in the trunk if possible.
